Communicating knowledge, expanding horizons, fostering integration

This year, C/O Berlin will extend its non-profit commitment and provide children and youths in socially disadvantaged living situations with the new programme Perspectives. Communicating artistic knowledge, playfully developing creativity, heightening awareness. In workshops lasting several days, the young participants will become familiar with visual media, ranging from photography to film, in teams with professional guidance.

In workshops specially conceived for the respective living environments of the young participants, C/O Berlin will provide diverse scope for development and inspiration for new experiences – on location in children' s and youth' s homes, in so-called "welcome classes" for immigrant children (sollten wir evtl. mehr erklären?) and in the Education Unit at C/O Berlin. At Perspectives artists with many years of practical experience from different genres will work together.

In 2015, C/O Berlin facilitated four workshops in collaboration with different partners and creative people. Between February and April youths were supervised in the education assistance network AWO-Erziehungshilfeverbund Strausberg. Using the

In march, pupils of the Heinz-Brandt School in Weißensee, together with the "welcome class", explored the complex theme of "home" and the associations and feelings connected with this, recording their thoughts in photographs and collages. In April, children and youths from the residential facility for refugees Goerzallee (gibt es einen Grund warum hier das Wort "Flüchtling" vermieden wurde?) went on a photo safari through Zehlendorf with the question "How on earth did I end up here?" In May, children from the "welcome class" of the **Gemeinschaftsschule Schöneberg** photographically presented their game of new identities with the theme "selfportrait and transformation".

Acknowledging cultural diversity, developing new ideas together, communicating knowledge – since 2006 C/O Berlin has committed itself to visual education with the programmes Junior and Teens. In 2012 C/O Berlin began an initial pilot project for Perspectives, gaining important experience and developing a long-term concept for the years ahead. This year, the Ernst Schering Foundation will support the programme, enabling the facilitation of a total of 8 workshops.
